Ser/estar

FORM: (am/are/is)
AUXILIARY: No auxiliary

AFFIRMATIVE:

I am happy

She is 20 years old

• NEGATIVE:

I am not tall

She isn't a student

• QUESTION:

Are you English?

Is she your sister?

Have Got

Tenir

FORM: have/has got
AUXILIARY: No auxiliary

• AFFIRMATIVE:

I have got a pen
She has got a pen

• NEGATIVE:

I haven't got a pen
She hasn't got a pen

• QUESTION:

Have you got a pen?

Has she got a pen?

Present Simple

Routines
Habits
True facts

FORM: V (+s/es)
AUXILIARY: DO/DOES

AFFIRMATIVE:

I work every day

She works every day

• NEGATIVE:

I don't work every day

She doesn't work every day

• QUESTION:

Do you work every day?

Does she work every day?

Present Continuous

Actions happening now or longer periods of time that will eventually end

FORM:
be (am/are/is) + V (+ing)

• AFFIRMATIVE:

I am working now

She is working now

• NEGATIVE:

I am not working now
She isn't working now

• QUESTION:

Are you working now?

Is she working now?

Past Simple

Action finished in the past

FORM:
V (+ed)/2nd column
AUXILIARY: DID

AFFIRMATIVE:

I worked yesterday

She saw me yesterday

NEGATIVE:

I didn't work yesterday

She didn't see me yesterday

• QUESTION:

Did you work yesterday?

Did she work yesterday?

Used to

to refer to habits or states in the past which are no longer true now

FORM: used to + V

• AFFIRMATIVE:

I used to swim when I was young

She used to swim when I was young

• NEGATIVE:

I didn't use to swim when I was young

She didn't use to swim when I was young

Did you use to swim when you were
young?

Did she use to swim when she was young?

Past Continuous

Action happening in a specific moment in the past

FORM:was/were+ V (+ing)

AFFIRMATIVE:

I was working at noon

She was working at noon

• NEGATIVE:

I was not working at noon

She wasn't working at noon

• QUESTION:

Were you working at noon?

Was she working at noon?

Present Perfect Simple

Action that started in the past and has a connection to the present. Past action at an indefinite time in the past

FORM: have/has + past
participle
(V+ed or 3rd column)

AFFIRMATIVE:

I have worked here for years

She has worked here for years

NEGATIVE:

I haven't worked here for years

She hasn't worked here for years

• QUESTION:

Have you ever worked here?

Has she ever worked here?

Present Perfect Continuous

Action that started in the past and is still going on. **Emphasis on the action**.

FORM: have/has + been + v (+ing)

AFFIRMATIVE:

I have been working here for years

She has been working here for years

NEGATIVE:

I haven't been working here for years

She hasn't been working here for years

• QUESTION:

How long have you been working here?

How long has she been working here?

Past Perfect Simple

Action finished before another past action.

FORM: had + past
participle

(V+ed or 3rd column)

AFFIRMATIVE:

I had worked here for years

She had worked here for years

• NEGATIVE:

I hadn't worked here for years

She hadn't worked here for years

• QUESTION:

Had you ever worked here?

Had she ever worked here?

Past Perfect Continuous

Action in the past that continued up to another past action. Emphasis on the action.

FORM: had + been +
V (+ing)

• AFFIRMATIVE:

I had been working here for years

She had been working here for years

• NEGATIVE:

I hadn't been working here for years

She hadn't been working here for years

• QUESTION:

How long had you been working here?

How long had she been working here?

Future (going to)

Decisions
Predictions
Plans

FORM: be (am/are/is)+ going to + V

AFFIRMATIVE:

I am going to work next year

She is going to work next year

• NEGATIVE:

I am not going to work next year

She isn't going to work next year

• QUESTION:

Are you going to work next year?

Is she going to work next year?

Future (will)

Voluntary actions
Promises
Predictions
Spontaneous decisions

FORM: will + V

AFFIRMATIVE:

I will work next year

She will work next year

• NEGATIVE:

I won't work next year
She won't work next year

• QUESTION:

Will you work next year?

--Will she work next year?

Future continuous

Future actions in progress

FORM: will + be + V (+ing)

AFFIRMATIVE:

I will be working next year

She will be working next year

NEGATIVE:

I won't be working next year

She won't be working next year

• QUESTION:

Will you be working next year?

--Will she be working next year?

Future perfect

Finished actions in the future

FORM: will + have + past participle (V+ed or 3rd column)

AFFIRMATIVE:

I will have worked three years

She will have worked three years

• NEGATIVE:

I won't have worked three years

She won't have worked three years

• QUESTION:

Will you have worked three years?
Will she have worked three years?

Modal Verbs

SHOULD (advice)
 CAN (ability,
permission, request)
MUST (obligation or
 prohibition)
WOULD (hypotheses,
politeness, past)

FORM: modal + V

• AFFIRMATIVE:

I should work next year

She can work next year

• NEGATIVE:

I mustn't work next year
She can't work next year

• QUESTION:

Would you work next year?

Should she work next year?
