

Past Perfect Simple and Past Perfect Continuous

Yesterday I had pizza for dinner / supper.

Before I *had sent* Alba a message and I *had been studying* for two hours.

used to / would

usually (present)

I *usually* have dinner with my granny.

I *usually* do gymnastics.

used to (past) - solía

I *used to* kiss my mom a lot when I was a child.

I *used to* do judo as a child.

It's common to use *used to* for situations that no longer exist.

I *used to* play theater, but now I don't.

would (past) — past habits

When I was 14, I *would / used to* play theater twice a week.

would = used to (but not for states)

You cannot use it for states.

I *used to* like banana as a child.

I **would like** banana as a child.

I used to live in Mallorca.

I **would live** in Mallorca.

Negative Form

I ***didn't*** *use to* eat paella when I was a child.

I ***wouldn't*** eat paella when I was a child.

Questions

Did you use to eat paella when you were a child?

Yes, I **did**.

No, I **didn't**.

Would you eat paella when you were a child?

Yes, I **would**.

No, I **wouldn't**.
