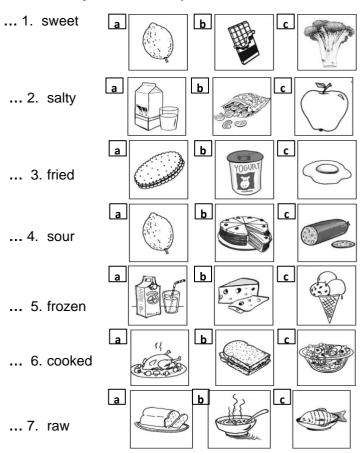

A FASHIONABLE WEDDING

Have you ever been to a wedding? The bride's dress is one of the most importantparts of the event, and most women spend a long time choosing the right one. Butwhat is the right dress? Wedding dresses, like other types of clothing, reflect the fashion of the time.

In Ancient Rome, people believed white was the favourite colour of the god of marriage, so women wore white wedding dresses. CITY LIFE

In the 1940s, it became fashionable for families in the United States to buy homes inresidential neighbourhoods outside the cities. These areas, called suburbs, were quiet and peaceful.
