Some of the Strangest Emergency Calls

The job of a telephone operator at the London Fire Brigade doesn't exactly sound like a laugh a minute. In fact, it sounds pretty stressful, to be honest. This week they revealed some of the strangest and funniest calls they have received.

Since 2016, people have called the Brigade 659 times (1)... to the fact that they are being trapped in the toilet. And there have been 56 incidents which involved family pets being trapped in some strange places. Other calls are less entertaining. There have been an incredible 30,000 calls over the past five years which turned (2)... to be pointless. Why people feel the need to do this is unknown. Tom George, Deputy Commissioner and Director of Operations at London Fire Brigade, is keen to point out that the Fire Brigade will always respond to genuine emergencies. The most unusual calls often involve children or animals, so Tom urges people to (5)... an eye on them in particular. They can get into some sticky situations if not.

Specific examples have been published to discourage people from making a 999 call rather (6)... encourage them.
