

Book Review Instructions

1. Introduction

Start by mentioning the book's title, author, genre, and setting.

Example: "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer by Mark Twain is an adventure and historical fiction book set in a small 19th-century town in Missouri."

2. Plot Summary

Write a short summary of the main events without giving away spoilers. Focus on the big picture of what happens in the book.

Example: "Tom Sawyer is a mischievous boy who loves adventures. He gets into trouble, solves mysteries, and learns important life lessons along the way."

3. Characters

Describe the main characters and their personalities. Who was your favorite and why?

Example: "Tom is clever and full of energy, while Huck is brave and loyal. I liked Huck the most because of his adventurous spirit."

4. Themes

Identify the main messages or lessons in the book. How do they connect to real life?

Example: "One important theme is friendship. Tom and Huck's bond shows how true friends support each other in every situation."

5. Personal Opinion

Share what you liked or didn't like about the book. Was there a favorite part?

Example: "My favorite part was when Tom tricked his friends into painting the fence. It was so funny and creative!"

6. Recommendation


Explain if you would recommend the book and why. Who would enjoy it?

Example: "I would recommend this book to anyone who loves adventure and funny stories. It's perfect for kids my age!"

7. Rating

Give the book a score out of 5 stars and explain your reasoning.

Example: "I give this book 4.5 out of 5 stars because it was exciting and fun, but some parts were a bit hard to understand."
